Very few participants have a desk in their home and 23 out of 27 youth surveyed said that they did not have a bookcase in their room. With \$616.45 in VTDC TANF funding, construction from Santa's Helpers and assistance from Sr. Michele's family, 30 elementary, middle and high school youth, sanded and painted their very own bookcase/nightstand. Youth learned professional painting skills. Most youth said they were going to put books on their self. A few said they would put a lamp on top so they could read in bed!
